Broader Coaching Matters on 15, 17, 19, 21 and 23 July.

15-07-22 - "Winning Through Pressure" - Frank Dick - (additional material will be provided by Malcom Carruthers)

What defines us as great or average coaches is our ability to make right decisions under pressure. This applies whether the pressure is in the arena, in training or in life. So winning or losing comes down to that. It is a look at how to be better prepared to cope with pressure; learn from it and use it to our advantage.

17-07-22 - "Gender Harmony" - Stephanie Hightower - (joining her, Curtis Frye and Paula Dunn)

Coaches and other leaders in sport are like the conductor of an orchestra. They must bring together diversity of physical, mental and emotional ability in pursuit of a common purpose then create harmony from that diversity. This session examines how that can be achieved.

19-07-22 - "Progressions in coaching practice and what is influencing them" - Jimmy Radcliffe

This will provide excellent insight to current coaching practice and how both positive and potential negative consequence of what has influenced change is being handled.

21-07-22 - "Impact of technological advance on athlete performance" - Peter Thompson - (additional material will be provided by Shalaya Kipp)

This will look at such things as current shoe technology, surfaces technology and other performance related technologies; and where things might progress to in tomorrow's arenas.
